DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Caserta is a frame complex consisting of a two-story, three-bay main block with gable roof, brick end with interior end chimney, and a one-and-one-half story end wing and hyphen, the end wing having a large exterior end chimney and a steeper gable roof than the hyphen. This wing is traditionally held to be the oldest portion of Caserta; however, there is no evidence, except for its basic form and roof silhouette, for an eighteenth-century date. The interior of the house is done in the Greek Revival manner with fluted moldings and corner "bull's eye" blocks around the windows and doors. A variety of mantels reflect, in a low key manner, the transition from Federal motifs to the sterner modes of the Greek Revival.

The most interesting architectural feature of the house is the upward extension of the front pitch of the roof over the western bay on the main block, so that its ridge line is several feet higher than the rest of the structure. Consequently, this portion of the building projects from the rear as an ell. On the interior, this creates a stair well in the side hall plan which rises up three stories to attic rooms lighted by end windows. The dramatic vertical space is occupied by a simple stair design whose rectangular balusters and plain rail gracefully curve at each turn in the rise.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Although the oldest part of Caserta may date from 1736 when the first William Haggoman inherited the land, or from the occupancy of his son William who inherited the property in 1764, there is little architectural evidence to support this. The large section was built by George P. Upshur (1799-1852), U. S. Naval Commander and brother of Judge Abel Parker Upshur of Vaucluse, who owned the property from 1836 to 1847. Upshur named his land Caserta after the town in Italy where he had spent many pleasant days. In 1852 Upshur died in Spezia, Italy, while there in command of the U. S. S. Levant. His remains were returned to the United States, and he was buried, with other members of his family, at Vaucluse where he was born.

In agreement with the tradition that portions of Caserta date from the eighteenth century is the idea that Upshur intended to add a wing to make the two-story block a formal central hall, five-bay front building. It certainly seems probable that the wing was built earlier and altered in the 1830's or 1840's when the large house was added. Today, Caserta appears as a typical Eastern Shore complex resulting from additions to a small house. Obviously, what makes it totally unique is the enlargement over the stair hall, especially interesting for its modern concept of reflecting interior spaces through exterior forms.






