

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Summary Description Paragraph

Dominion Hills, platted in 1942 and developed between 1945 and 1948, is a residential subdivision located in western Arlington County, Virginia, just five miles southwest of Washington, D.C. The 102-acre suburban neighborhood was designed to attract the working and middle-income residents drawn to the Washington metropolitan area in the years leading up to and following World War II. Strategically developed to take advantage of the undulating landscape and proximity to Four Mile Run and the route of the Washington and Old Dominion Railroad, Dominion Hills is today bounded by North Four Mile Run Drive and Interstate 66 to the north, North Larrimore Street to the east, and both North McKinley Road and North Montana Road to the west. The commercial zone along Wilson Boulevard lies to the south (just outside of the neighborhood's boundaries). Developed simultaneously by two merchant-builder companies, Dominion Hills contains three subdivisions – Paisley, Dominion Hills, and Section Two of Dominion Hills. Benson & Vest developed the Paisley section of the suburb, located in the northwest corner of the neighborhood, while Mace Properties, Inc. developed the larger sections of Dominion Hills and Section Two of Dominion Hills, comprising the eastern portion – and majority – of the neighborhood. Although initially platted in 1942, because of World War II and the shortage of building materials and supplies, Dominion Hills did not develop until April 1945; the neighborhood progressed rapidly, with construction completed in only three years. The vast majority of the single-family houses in the amalgamated neighborhood were constructed by Mace Properties, which built 367 houses, reflecting two different models with minimal variation. Benson & Vest was responsible for the construction of 67 single-family dwellings, offering three different models. Despite being the work of two independent merchant builders, Dominion Hills is a cohesive neighborhood composed exclusively of two-story Colonial Revival-style houses; no other architectural styles or influences were identified in Dominion Hills. Unlike the majority of neighborhoods in Arlington County that were laid out and developed by subdividers, community builders, and operative builders, the houses in Dominion Hills reflect the principles of mass production, standardization, and large-scale development typical of merchant builders, making it one of the few neighborhoods in the county that strongly and consistently adhered to repetition of style, form, materials, and setbacks/siting.

Narrative Description

Site Description

Dominion Hills is an exclusively residential neighborhood located on a 102-acre tract of land in western Arlington County. Lying just south of Interstate 66 and north of Wilson Boulevard, the neighborhood is bordered by the communities of Westover to the north, Bluemont to the west, Boulevard Manor to the south, and Madison Manor to the west. Consistent with the sloping setting implied by its name, the topography of Dominion Hills consists of gently rolling hills highlighted by curvilinear streets with cul-de-sacs that take advantage of the natural features of the land. The hilly nature of the neighborhood is such that many houses sit

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above street level with partially raised basements and embankments that slope downward to the street, while a number of houses are sited on terrain sloping below street level, thus allowing for partially exposed basements. Mature trees line many of the streets in the community. Lots within the three subdivisions of Dominion Hills are roughly standardized. Those in the Paisley subdivision are approximately 55 feet wide by 100 feet deep, while lots in Dominion Hills and Section Two of Dominion Hills are approximately 50 feet by 125 feet and 60 feet by 100 feet, respectively. Overall, houses have a consistent setback of roughly 30 feet and sit on landscaped lots with rear yards. Public concrete sidewalks front the properties, the majority of which have driveways that lead to the sides of the lots. The wide streets comfortably accommodate on-street parking and, as a result, there are few freestanding garages in the Dominion Hills neighborhood. The original plat for Section Two of Dominion Hills established Patrick Henry Drive, running south-north, as the primary corridor at the center of the neighborhood. Accordingly, this residential street is broader than the other streets in the neighborhood and leads to a traffic plaza dedicated to street and drainage purposes at its northern terminus and intersection with North Four Mile Run Drive.

Architectural Description

The planned mid-twentieth-century residential neighborhood of Dominion Hills is comprised entirely of two-story detached single-family dwellings designed in the Colonial Revival style. Square or slightly rectangular in form, these modest houses were constructed immediately after the close of World War II by two development companies – Benson & Vest and Mace Properties. At that time, the popular and widespread Colonial Revival style was the style of choice developers and architects employed for residential suburban development, especially in Arlington County. First appearing in the late nineteenth century as the fashionable choice for architectural firms and favored for the residences of wealthy clients, the Colonial Revival style became increasingly popular in the first half of the twentieth century, especially for dwellings within the burgeoning suburbs. However, these Colonial Revival-style buildings, for the most part, exhibited a more modest form and detailing. In general, the adaptation of the style to the single-family dwellings of Dominion Hills resulted in uncomplicated two-story houses with symmetrical fenestration, rowlock sills, gabled roofs, and, in some cases, decorative door surrounds.

Although Dominion Hills is recognized for its repetition and similarity throughout, distinct, yet subtle, differences allow for easy identification of buildings constructed by Benson & Vest and those erected by Mace Properties. The three models produced by Benson & Vest, all located within the smaller Paisley subdivision in the western section of the neighborhood, stand two stories in height and two bays deep with a modest rectangular or square form topped by a side gable roof. Typical of the period, the houses are constructed of concrete blocks veneered with brick. The first model constructed by Benson & Vest is easily identified by its one-story open porch on the side elevation that shelters the main entry of the two-bay-wide dwelling. This secondary façade is also marked by an exterior-end brick chimney. Symmetrically fenestrated, window openings

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of Benson & Vest houses have 6/6, double-hung, wood sash with brick rowlock sills. Openings on the façade are edged with inoperable shutters. The interiors of the basements are illuminated by small, one-light window openings with brick rowlock sills. The houses are covered by side-gabled roofs of asphalt shingles; the one-story, one-bay porches on the side elevations have shed roofs of asphalt shingles. The upper gable ends of the houses are clad with asbestos shingles (in some instances the asbestos shingles have been replaced with vinyl or aluminum siding, although the vast majority of the houses retain the original asbestos shingles). Unlike houses constructed by Mace Properties, the dwellings in Benson & Vest's Paisley subdivision have driveways that extend from the street along the sides of the property, generally at the elevation opposite from the porch and main entry. Benson & Vest constructed only nine of these two-story, two-bay-wide models with a side porch; all were erected in 1945. These include 1047, 1043, 1039, 1031, 1327, and 1019 North McKinley Road, 5980 and 5974 10th Road North, and 1024 North Montana Street.

The second model introduced by Benson & Vest in 1945 was three bays wide with a central entry. These houses appear to be slightly deeper and somewhat squarer in form than the two-story, two-bay-wide version. The single-leaf main entries are sheltered by one-story, one-bay-square porches with front-gabled roofs supported by square wood posts. Typical of the period, the upper gable ends of the porches are clad with asbestos shingles. Narrow boxed cornices finish the asphalt-shingled, side-gabled roofs of the main blocks, providing minimal stylistic ornamentation typical of the Colonial Revival style. Like the two-bay-wide models, these houses have one-story, one-bay-square porches and exterior-end brick chimneys on the side elevations. Open porches sit on raised foundations and have shed roofs supported by square wood posts. Asbestos shingles cover the upper gable ends of the porches, which provide access to a secondary entry into the main block. Brick rowlock sills adorn the 6/6, double-hung, wood-sash windows, which are edged with inoperable shutters on the façade. Driveways extend from the street to the side elevations opposite from the side porches. Sixteen illustrations of the second model were erected by Benson & Vest in 1945. They include the houses at 1035, 1023, and 1015 North McKinley Road, 1043, 1040, 1037, 1036, 1032, 1031, 1028, 1020, and 1016 North Montana Street, and 5985, 5981, 5917, and 5966 10th Road North. In 1946 and 1947, Benson & Vest offered the same house without the side porch. These 35 houses are located on the northern end of North Montana Street and along North Manchester Street.

In 1948, Benson & Vest introduced their third and final house design in the Paisley subdivision. Only two elements distinguish this model from the 1945 two-story, three-bay-wide houses – these new houses are slightly larger, both in width and depth, and incorporate one-car garages into the lower levels of the side porches. To accommodate the garages, the one-story, one-bay-square porches were built slightly wider than the 1945 version. These seven examples are located at 1057, 1063, and 1059 North Montana Street and 5969, 5965, 5961, and 5960 10th Road North. With the construction of these houses in 1948, the Paisley subdivision of Dominion Hills was fully developed.

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The dwellings constructed by Mace Properties are notably similar to those of Benson & Vest, reflecting the traditional suburban ideal home buyers sought in the post-World War II years. These houses, comprising the subdivisions of Dominion Hills and Section Two of Dominion Hills – constituting the bulk of the neighborhood – consist of two models, both of which share a number of similarities and are nearly identical in form, massing, design, materials, stylistic expression, and setback/siting – qualities that are typical of houses constructed by the few merchant builders in Arlington County and the many working nationwide. The first model introduced in 1945 in Dominion Hills was a two-story, side-gabled dwelling. Dressed minimally in the Colonial Revival style, these houses are three bays wide and two bays deep. Compared with the houses being constructed simultaneously by Benson & Vest, they are squarer in form and lack side porches. The houses by Mace Properties are constructed of concrete blocks covered in an American-bond brick veneer and finished with soldier-coursed water tables and stringcourses. The side-gabled roofs, covered in asphalt shingles, have shallow cornices with false returns that are flush on the side elevations. Brick chimneys with a projecting belt course extend from the exterior ends of the buildings. The window openings, which are symmetrically placed, have 6/6 double-hung sash with wood sills and narrow molded surrounds; the openings on the facades are flanked by inoperable shutters. The primary entries are located in the end bay of the facades, ornately framed by Colonial Revival-style wood surrounds. Secondary entries, some covered by shed roofs, pierce the side elevations of the buildings.

Unlike Benson & Vest, which constructed dwellings with little to no variation, individuality of the buildings designed by Mace Properties was commonly achieved simply and solely by varying the detailing that framed the primary entries on the facades. Mace Properties alternated the designs, ensuring that identical surrounds were not constructed on neighboring houses. Further, the developer was keenly aware that the traditional elements of the Colonial Revival style were essential to prospective home buyers of the late 1940s. In Dominion Hills, the style is best expressed through door surrounds that are all constructed of wood. These surrounds incorporate plain or fluted Tuscan pilasters, stepped or ogee moldings, narrow friezes, projecting ogee-molded architraves and cornices, dentil moldings, keystones, and/or pediments. The dwellings at 1029 through 1045 North Larrimore Street, for example, illustrate the various entry surrounds used by Mace Properties and include closed triangular pediments, open semicircular or triangular pediments, swan's neck pediments, and segmentally arched pediments. A total of 162 examples of Mace Properties' first model were constructed in Dominion Hills.

The second design option offered by Mace Properties was introduced in 1945, but was primarily constructed from 1946 to 1947. Section Two of Dominion Hills is composed solely of these models, while only five examples are found in the original section of Dominion Hills. Yet, these houses are similar in design, plan, massing, and fenestration to the contemporaneous houses being erected in the original section. They stand two stories in height and are three bays wide and two bays deep with a side gable roof. The main entry is located in the end bay. The asphalt-shingled roofs have narrow boxed cornices. Exterior-end chimneys have a belt course on the upper portion of the stack. Rather than being fully veneered with brick, the first stories of these houses are

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faced with brick and the upper stories are clad with asbestos shingles. These buildings all have a soldier-coursed water table. They are symmetrically fenestrated with 6/6, double-hung, wood-sash windows, as well as a secondary single-leaf entry on the side elevation. Some of these side entries, providing easy access to the driveway, are covered by one-story, one-bay-square shed-roofed porches. Inoperable shutters edge the window openings on the façade, and first-story window openings have brick rowlock sills. Ornamentation of the houses constructed in Section Two of Dominion Hills is primarily limited to brick entry surrounds. These surrounds include a soldier-course lintel with either stacked bricks flanking the entry or a basket-weave pattern that frames the opening, suggestive of shutters. The dwelling at 970 North Longfellow Street has a stacked brick surround, while the neighboring dwelling at 977 North Longfellow Street has a basket-weave surround. These modest details were an inexpensive way to provide some stylistic emphasis on the primary entry opening and allow for further distinction among the houses in the neighborhood. A total of 205 illustrations of this second model were erected by Mace Properties.

Dominion Hills contains 430 primary resources. As platted, the Paisley subdivision initially contained 67 lots. Benson & Vest improved all of these lots between 1945 and 1948. The two houses at 1084 and 1085 North Manchester Street were demolished ca. 1970 in anticipation of Interstate 66, a six-lane highway that would run from the District of Columbia westward through Arlington County along the former route of the Washington and Old Dominion Railroad. In 1994, new houses were erected on these lots, which ultimately were not necessary for the construction of the highway. In 1999, the house at 1031 North Montana Street was demolished and replaced with a new house the following year. The lot was subsequently subdivided and a second non-historic house was constructed next door at 1033 North Montana Street. Thus, there are now 68 primary resources in the Paisley subdivision. The plat of Dominion Hills originally provided for 210 lots. Seven of these lots remained unimproved and Mace Properties, Inc. constructed 162 houses on the remaining lots. One property, 901 North Larrimore Street, was improved in 1948 by a different, unrelated builder. There are now 163 primary resources in the original section of Dominion Hills. When platted by Mace Properties, Inc., Section Two of Dominion Hills contained 219 lots. Mace constructed 205 houses. As a result of the construction of Interstate 66, six of these houses were demolished along North Four Mile Run Drive. There are now 199 primary resources in Section Two of Dominion Hills.

Secondary Resources

The secondary resources in Dominion Hills consist primarily of garages and storage sheds. Based on the Sanborn Insurance Maps of the area, only four detached garages had been constructed in the neighborhood by 1959. These four historic garages, which remain extant, have been joined by a number of non-historic garages, the majority of which were constructed in the 1970s. In platting Section Two of Dominion Hills, Mace Properties included language within the deed to the property that prohibited the construction of metal garages in order to regulate the character of the garages in the subdivision. As a result, the garages in this section typically

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reflect the same architectural design and materials of the primary dwelling. Garages in the earlier sections that comprise Dominion Hills also exhibit a similar architectural aesthetic as their primary dwellings. Most of the garages are one story in height and one bay in width. They are constructed of concrete blocks faced with brick and have a front-gabled roof of asphalt shingles. The garages are generally located to the rear of the house, along a side elevation, and are accessible by a paved driveway. The garages are primarily fenestrated by multi-paneled, roll-up vehicular doors.

Storage sheds, which are not original to Dominion Hills, are also characteristically one story high and one bay wide. They are overwhelmingly constructed of wood frame and typically have gable or shed roofs with single- or double-leaf entry doors. These wood and metal prefabricated storage sheds are typically located to the rear of the properties.

Physical Integrity

Dominion Hills retains exceptionally high levels of integrity of design, location, setting, feeling, and association that are not seen in other parts of Arlington County. However, typical of most residential neighborhoods, sensitive alterations and additions have occurred in varying degrees in Dominion Hills. The most common alterations include replacement of original materials, typically for maintenance purposes. Exterior replacement cladding, such as aluminum and vinyl, has been applied as fashion dictates and maintenance requires, particularly to replace (or cover over) the original asbestos shingles of the houses. However, these materials maintain the horizontality of the original asbestos shingles. Some houses have been enlarged with modest rear and side additions that are typically not visible from the street and, thus, do not affect the integrity of the building's design or setting. In general, these changes do not diminish the integrity of the buildings, nor Dominion Hills as a whole. Alterations that have occurred have, for the most part, been sensitive to the original design, workmanship, and feeling of the neighborhood. In addition, a remarkably small number of teardowns and new construction have occurred in the neighborhood in the last half of the twentieth century; most demolitions occurred to make way for the construction of Interstate 66, which was built in the late 1960s. Although new buildings attempt to be compatible with the predominant Colonial Revival style of the neighborhood, their style, form, and materials render them easily identifiable. Taken as a whole, any alterations or additions in the neighborhood have not diminished the integrity of Dominion Hills, resulting in a cohesive neighborhood that possesses all seven qualities of integrity (location, setting, workmanship, materials, design, feeling, and association).

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Historic District Inventory Report

In the following inventory, all resources have been considered either contributing or non-contributing based upon the areas of significance indicated under Criteria A and C under the themes of Architecture and/or Community Planning/Development, and based upon the period of significance that extends from 1942 to 1948. This period of significance was established through the archival research necessary to establish an historic context and the on-site survey that identified resources to support that context. This period reflects the 1942 platting of the neighborhood before World War II and the commencement of construction in 1945 by merchant builders, Mace Properties, Inc. and Benson & Vest. This period encompasses the full development of the Paisley, Dominion Hills, and Section Two of Dominion Hills subdivisions, all completed in 1948. Therefore, all non-contributing resources are either constructed before 1942 or after 1945. Additionally, although constructed within the period of significance, resources that do not retain sufficient integrity due to alterations and additions, and therefore cannot represent the period and areas of significance, have been deemed non-contributing. 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Period of Significance (justification)

The period of significance for Dominion Hills is 1942 to 1948. This period reflects the 1942 platting of the neighborhood before World War II and the commencement of construction in 1945 by merchant builders, Mace Properties, Inc. and Benson & Vest. This period encompasses the full development of the Paisley, Dominion Hills, and Section Two of Dominion Hills subdivisions, all completed in 1948.

Statement of Significance Summary Paragraph (Provide a summary paragraph that includes level of significance and applicable criteria.)

Dominion Hills in Arlington County, Virginia, is significant as a planned mid-twentieth-century residential neighborhood constructed to meet the burgeoning housing needs of Washington, D.C.'s returning veterans and government population after World War II. The neighborhood is composed exclusively of two-story Colonial Revival-style houses constructed between 1945 and 1948. The initial platting of Dominion Hills occurred in 1942 by two independent subdividers; however, because of World War II and the shortage of necessary building materials and supplies, development of the area did not take place until April 1945 when two development companies, working separately yet in concert as merchant builders, commenced construction. Benson & Vest developed the Paisley section, while Mace Properties, Inc. developed Dominion Hills and Section Two of Dominion Hills. These two companies, building their subdivisions simultaneously, used repetition of form, style, materials, and setting/siting to create a cohesive suburb. Unlike many neighborhoods in Arlington County that present a wide variety of architectural forms, styles, and periods of development, Dominion Hills exhibits a singular architectural style, offers only a handful of models with minimal variation, and respects the homeowners' predilection toward the traditional architectural elements projected by the Colonial Revival style. Dominion Hills is a model research and development neighborhood that demonstrates the merchant builders' principles of mass production, standardization, and large-scale development that is infrequent in Arlington County, yet is reflective of post-war development in the United States. The neighborhood, while espousing the principles of the Federal Housing Administration (FHA) and Better Homes Movement without utilizing the funding or mortgage insurance, distinguishes itself by being one of only three merchant builder neighborhoods in Arlington County (of those, Arlington Forest [1938-1945] and Claremont [1946-1954] are already listed in the National Register of Historic Places). Dominion Hills, as an amalgamated post-World War II residential neighborhood, retains an exceptionally high level of integrity that is not seen elsewhere in Arlington County.

Dominion Hills meets National Register Criteria A and C, and is significant under the themes of architecture and community planning/development with a period of significance that extends from 1942 to 1948. These

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dates encompass the platting and subsequent construction and development of the Paisley, Dominion Hills, and Section Two of Dominion Hills subdivisions by Benson & Vest and Mace Properties, Inc. Dominion Hills is being nominated under the Multiple Property Nomination, *Historic Residential Suburbs in the United States, 1830-1960* (National Park Service, 2002) as an example of a merchant builder neighborhood reflecting the post-World War II housing demands and requirements. The neighborhood is composed exclusively of single-family dwellings exhibiting the Colonial Revival style and contains 430 primary resources, of which only eight are non-contributing because of alterations and new construction. Dominion Hills retains exceptionally high levels of integrity of design, setting, feeling, and association that distinguishes it as a significant neighborhood of Arlington County.

Dominion Hills is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A and C and is significant for its **Architecture**, as well as for its **Community Planning and Development**.

Criterion A: *Property is associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history.*

Dominion Hills meets Criterion A of the National Register of Historic Places as a planned mid-twentieth-century residential suburb of Washington, D.C. The subdivisions of Paisley and the first two sections of Dominion Hills that now comprise the neighborhood, although platted in 1942 by Frederick Pilcher and Parkhurst, Inc., respectively, were not developed until April 1945. This development delay, due to a shortage of building materials that resulted from war needs and restrictions, allowed new developers to enter the speculative project. Responding to an increased need for housing for the growing number of employees of the federal government, related agencies, military, and returning veterans, Benson & Vest and Mace Properties, Inc., acted as merchant builders to develop Dominion Hills, which was completed in 1948. Advertisements for Dominion Hills touted the community's short distance from the newly constructed Pentagon and were directed to federal and military workers. An excellent and rare example of how merchant builders operated in Arlington County, Dominion Hills was prepared in sections with the rapid construction of a large number of houses that were sold as built, thus allowing the developers to quickly finance additional phases of construction. Many merchant builders during this time were supported by federal incentives and laid out neighborhoods according to the guidelines of the Federal Housing Administration (FHA). Although it remains unknown if the builders of Dominion Hills secured FHA funding, their developments closely adhered to the standards set forth by the federal agency, as well as those of the Better Homes Movement, also prevalent at the time. Adhering to these guidelines and standards ensured that Arlingtonians could afford to purchase a house in the post-war suburban neighborhood of Dominion Hills, thus attaining the quintessential American dream of "middle-class status, financial prosperity, and family stability."¹ Moreover, unlike most residential suburbs of Arlington County that

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were developed by community and operative builders who established relatively small subdivisions or improved only a few adjacent lots within a larger neighborhood, Dominion Hills reads as a cohesive neighborhood planned developed by two builders working collaboratively. The resulting unified neighborhood shows that Benson & Vest and Mace Properties, Inc. embraced the FHA standards and guidelines, and adhered to the principles of mass production, standardization, and large-scale development typical of merchant builders. As such, Dominion Hills is important in understanding the development history of Arlington County in the post-war years as it was unlike elsewhere in the greater Washington metropolitan area, Virginia, and the nation. In addition, it represents Arlington County's important association with the expansion of housing linked to wartime and the post-war industries of World War II.

Criterion C: Property embodies the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction or represents the work of a master, or possesses high artistic values, or represents a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction.

Dominion Hills meets Criterion C of the National Register of Historic Places for its collection of dwellings that typify merchant builder housing in the mid-twentieth century. The neighborhood was developed exclusively with two-story, square and slightly rectangular Colonial Revival-style houses that created a suburban ideal sought by homeowners in the post-war era. The five models constructed by Benson & Vest and Mace Properties, Inc., all share a number of similarities and are nearly identical in form, massing, design, materials, stylistic expression, and setback/siting – qualities that are typical of houses constructed by merchant builders.

The goal of the developers of Dominion Hills was to minimize cost, increase output, and build houses that were attractive to the growing number of government workers, returning war veterans, and their families who were flocking to the nation's capital. Development companies simplified the domestic form, providing a familiar and desirable two-story form that acknowledged homeowners' predilection for traditional architectural elements expounded by the Colonial Revival style. Despite using minimal ornamentation and offering a limited number of options to buyers, the builders of Dominion Hills were able to provide attractive housing with all of the modern conveniences that successfully attracted prospective homeowners to the newly developed neighborhood.

Both builders took advantage of the setting of their lots, building houses into the gently sloping terrain that were large enough to comfortably accommodate the two-story structures. By designing brick-veneered, concrete-block houses, the builders were able to secure large amounts of materials at a reduced price and were able to use mass production and standardization to further reduce building costs. Brick was an inexpensive building material in this area as many successful brick yards were established in Arlington County. The use of asbestos shingles on the second stories and upper gable ends by Mace Properties showed the builder's interest in introducing a modern material on a traditional house form that was certain to be accepted. Although available in the years prior to the war, the use of asbestos shingles quickly grew in popularity in the 1940s because of its

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availability and advantages over wood cladding. Fire-resistant, inexpensive, and durable, asbestos held paint well and allowed homeowners to customize their houses at a low cost, thereby distinguishing themselves from their neighbors. Mace Properties also provided variety by introducing stringcourses to some models and ornamenting entry openings with stylized pedimented wood or patterned brick surrounds. Great care was taken to ensure that identical ornamentation was avoided on adjacent houses. Stylized door surrounds were alternated and house plans were flipped to create diversity and individuality within the repetition.

By 1948, the neighborhood of Dominion Hills was fully developed. The collection of houses in the neighborhood, while reflecting the principles of community planning, specifically that of merchant builders, and providing a strong representation of traditional Colonial Revival-style architecture, stands as a consistently designed and unified post-war residential neighborhood that is not commonplace in Arlington County.

Developmental history/additional historic context information (if appropriate)

Pre-Dating the Initial Platting of Dominion Hills

Dominion Hills is located in western Arlington, a twenty-six-square-mile county located in Northern Virginia across the Potomac River from Washington, D.C. The county is bounded by Fairfax County to the north and west, the City of Alexandria and Four Mile Run to the south, and the waters of the Potomac River to the east. Like most of western Arlington County, the area that was to become the neighborhood of Dominion Hills was predominantly rural during the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. First inhabited by Native Americans, specifically the Algonquian-speaking Powhatans whose chiefdom was the largest and most centralized of the southern Algonquian polities, the area was defined by several large colonial land grants and remained sparsely populated by early settlers and yeoman farmers.² By the mid-nineteenth century, the property was owned by Nicholas Febrey (1800-1868), a civic leader in what was then Alexandria County and one of the largest landholders in the area. Febrey had acquired the land from Rebecca A. Upton, whose nearby family estate at Upton Hill, owing to its geographic height and strategic location, served as a major fortification during the Civil War.³ An 1865 map of the Civil War defenses of Washington clearly depicts the strategic location of Upton's Hill and the adjoining Febrey estate to the east.⁴ The immense Febrey property, cut through by Four Mile Run, the meandering stream that ran southeast from Fairfax County to empty into the Potomac River, was particularly fertile and suitable for farmland. Taking advantage of the valley's rich soil, the land where Dominion Hills would develop in the mid-twentieth century was covered by extensive orchards in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

After Febrey's death, the land passed to his son, John Edward Febrey (1831-1893), a wealthy farmer who was active in real estate and served as the Superintendent of Schools in the early 1890s.⁵ John E. Febrey and his wife, Mary Frances Ball (1835- c.1912), built a house on the property circa 1865 just north of today's Wilson

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Boulevard. According to the 1878 Hopkins Map of Alexandria County, the area that now encompasses Dominion Hills was associated with the Febrey family, by then a locally established farming family, with Nicholas Febrey's second wife, Amanda Ball (b. 1818), overseeing land totaling 120 acres.⁶ In 1898, after John E. Febrey's death, the estate, consisting of about 73 acres, was purchased by Alvin M. Lothrop (1847-1912), one of the founders of the Woodward and Lothrop department store, who, after renovating the existing house, used the property as both a farm and summer home.⁷ The property remained in the Lothrop family until about 1950, when it transferred to the developer Randolph D. Rouse, but not before about 50 acres was sold for development of what would become the Dominion Hills subdivisions.⁸ Today, the large two-story Febrey-Lothrop House, which incorporates the original rectangular farmhouse that John E. Febrey constructed as its rear wing, remains a vestige of the area's mid-nineteenth-century and early-twentieth-century heritage. The house, located at 6407 Wilson Boulevard, near the intersection with McKinley Road, overlooks Dominion Hills' western border.

During the nineteenth century, development of the area was closely tied to the establishment of the Alexandria, Loudoun and Hampshire Railway, which, in 1853, extended its route southward along Four Mile Run to Alexandria and, by 1859, ran through the Febrey farmland on a single track. During the Civil War (1861-1865), the railroad, devastated both financially and physically, changed ownerships numerous times, before being restored in 1868. In January 1882, the railroad was purchased by the Washington and Western Railroad Company, which subsequently sold it to the Washington, Ohio, and Western Railroad Company. By the first decade of the twentieth century, the line reorganized to become the Washington and Old Dominion (W&OD) Railroad, which, soon after, offered an electric line. With newly established electric railways servicing the area, small communities began to develop along the route and real estate operators began subdividing land.⁹ For instance, the nearby neighborhood of Highland Park, first developed as Fostoria in 1890, sprang up in close proximity to the Washington, Arlington, and Falls Church Electric Railway, thus allowing residents to take advantage of the passenger service that the train provided from Rosslyn to East Falls Church, which traveled along Four Mile Run.¹⁰ The W&OD Railroad ceased operations in 1941, although freight and mail service continued until the railroad disbanded in the late 1960s. Today, the W&OD Regional Trail runs along the former railroad right-of-way, where it connects to the Four Mile Run Trail near the northwestern corner of Dominion Hills.

In the years leading up to and during World War II (1941-1945), the area and surrounding county, known since 1920 as Arlington County, continued to flourish. Capitalizing on new transportation improvements in the region, the area's population doubled in four years – from 57,000 in 1940 to 120,000 in 1944. By 1948, the population had reached 123,832. Consequently, the housing needs for the county were tremendous. The new residents, generally not affluent, struggled to meet developers' prices as “[m]aterial shortages, government regulations, scarce labor, and reduced incomes” all adversely affected Americans' hopes for buying a house.¹¹ As a result of the housing situation, low-cost single-family housing became a dominant residential building type constructed in Arlington during this time. When the developers of the Dominion Hills neighborhood purchased

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land for their speculative venture in the early 1940s, they would have been fully aware of the social climate and housing situation and actively targeted the middle-class clientele for their prospective subdivisions.

Initial Platting of Dominion Hills and Construction Challenges

The residential neighborhood of Dominion Hills, like many of its contemporaneous suburbs of Arlington County, is composed of a number of separate subdivisions. Specifically, Dominion Hills includes three sections – Paisley (1941), Dominion Hills (1941), and Section Two of Dominion Hills (1946). Paisley, a small subdivision of 67 lots, was platted in January 1942 by Frederick Pilcher who had purchased what was then undeveloped farmland in 1941.¹² Although little is known about this man, a review of U.S. Census records and local newspapers reveals that there was a Frederick Pilcher (1877-1954), of Petersburg, Virginia, who was active in real estate. He was elected president of The Petersburg Building and Loan Association in 1935.¹³ In addition, he served several terms as treasurer of the Virginia Manufacturers Association in the mid- to late 1940s.¹⁴ It is plausible that this is the same Pilcher, as he would have been interested in real estate in this rapidly growing area of the country. The proposed Paisley subdivision, located in Western Arlington County, was situated on land defined by gentle hills and valleys, just south of the W&OD railroad line.

A few months later in April 1942, Parkhurst, Inc. platted the subdivision of Dominion Hills, consisting of 210 lots located to the east of Paisley. This new subdivision took its name from the sloping topography and its proximity to the railroad.¹⁵ Parkhurst, Inc., with principal offices in Arlington County, was a large and successful (albeit short-lived) development company operating in the “low-price field.” The corporation organized in 1939 with Colonel Paul B. Parker, a graduate of West Point, as president and E.H. Wilcox, former supervising engineer inspector with the United States Government, as vice president.¹⁶ Taking advantage of the “home-buying public” that was “ready and eager to accept low-cost quality dwellings,” and the continued increase in housing demands in the area, the company quickly grew and built houses in the subdivisions of Parkhurst and nearby Allencrest in Arlington County, before financial troubles caused it to declare bankruptcy in May 1942.¹⁷

The platting of Paisley and Dominion Hills in 1942 by subdividers, who expected to benefit from the sale of unimproved lots, reflects the expansion of the area to meet the Washington area’s burgeoning population and increased demand for housing. Yet, because of the United States’ entry into World War II in December 1941 and the ensuing scarcity of building materials for civilian purposes, development of these two subdivisions did not take place until 1945. Reflected nationally, residential construction slowed because of the war effort and limited the availability of construction and buildings materials that were increasingly allocated among potential users by the federal government’s War Production Board. Builders seeking priority for construction materials had to conform to the Federal Housing Administration (FHA) requirements that were designed to provide affordable housing for war workers and military families in designated defense areas, which included

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metropolitan Washington, D.C., where the influx of war workers created a severe housing shortage. During this time, construction in the District and in the surrounding areas was essentially limited to apartments and small, simple houses or low-cost housing using alternative and often new construction materials.

Thus, single-family development in Arlington County was largely postponed during the war, despite it being designated a defense area. Development of the Paisley and Dominion Hills subdivisions, no different than other speculative real estate ventures during this time, stalled during the war and eventually changed ownership and management companies before construction began. Unwilling or financially unable to proceed, Pilcher sold the undeveloped Paisley subdivision to builders Benson & Vest. Likewise, Parkhurst, Inc. sold Dominion Hills to fellow real estate developers Mace Properties, Inc., sometime prior to April 1945 when the first building permits were granted.¹⁸ Being platted, and subsequently sold, separately by two independent developers suggests Paisley and Dominion Hills were not intended to be merged as a single neighborhood, which was the ultimate fate under the direction of Benson & Vest and Mace Properties, Inc.

Post-War Development of Dominion Hills

At the end of World War II, after five years of deferred local and national construction, there was a severe national housing shortage. Further, it was anticipated that demand for housing would surge as service men and women were discharged from the military and began marrying and starting families. The National Housing Agency predicted in 1944 that there would be a need for an additional 12,600,000 housing units in the post-war decade.¹⁹ Ten million service personnel were discharged from the military from 1945 to 1946. In this same period, it was estimated that, nationally, 2.5 million “reunited families and recently married couples had to double up with relatives” in order to find housing.²⁰ It was during this time that plans for the Dominion Hills neighborhood were finally realized.

Most of the post-war demand, both within the Washington metropolitan area and nationwide, was for low or moderately priced housing. During this time, about “75 percent of the five million families seeking homes could afford no more than \$60 a month in rent, and they could pay no more than \$6,000 for a house.”²¹ Even in Arlington County, where public and private building projects had greatly expanded the stock of moderately priced housing during the war, supply was still inadequate to meet the need. Although many of Arlington County’s residents moved to the area to fill defense-related jobs during World War II, they tended to remain in the area after the war and the continuously growing population created a strong demand for single-family housing. As described in a study of post-war tract housing in Washington, “with the federal government as the main employer, the local consumer market had a larger percentage of white-collar, lower-middle and middle-class workers, contributing to a median income that was among the highest in the nation.”²²

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With some restrictions lifted and materials becoming more available, construction commenced in April and May 1945 in the Dominion Hills and Paisley subdivisions. These developments were among the first post-war projects in Arlington County. The *Washington Post* reported on September 11, 1945 that housing projects costing nearly three million dollars were already under way at Dominion Hills, Paisley, and nearby Barcroft.²³

Of the 67 lots in the Paisley subdivision, the majority of improvements were constructed in 1945 and 1946. A total of 11 dwellings were constructed in 1947 and 1948 to complete the subdivision by developers Benson & Vest. Prior to their establishment of Paisley, Benson & Vest had limited real estate experience in Arlington County. In 1940, before material restrictions and government guidelines dictated housing construction, Benson & Vest developed Douglas Park, a modest neighborhood in the central part of the county described in the *Washington Post* as a “low cost home project” with houses of “Cape Cod and Colonial design.”²⁴ Also in 1940, Benson & Vest contributed to the development of residential property on and adjoining South Pollard Street, where the area was “built up with attractive low-cost homes.”²⁵ The houses, constructed with five and six rooms in the Cape Cod form, were offered with FHA-insured mortgages. The merchant builders were not only able to hone their talents in Douglas Park by producing cost-effective housing that reflected the popular Colonial Revival style, but were also able to become well-versed in the principles promoted by FHA-insured housing in their Arlington County developments; this served them well in their efficient development of the Paisley subdivision of Dominion Hills five years later. Operating out of an Arlington office on South Glebe Road, Benson & Vest, known as “specialists in low-cost housing” and “small home construction” continued to embark on small residential development projects in Arlington until the early 1950s.²⁶ The last advertisement found in the *Washington Post* placed by the builders was in May 1951 for the sale of a “California type ranch” house on Nottingham Street in North Arlington.

Early advertisements in local newspapers for Benson & Vest’s Paisley subdivision of Dominion Hills highlighted the location, quality construction, and various amenities of the spacious houses. For instance, one advertisement in the *Washington Post* for 1023 North McKinley Road, located in the “lovely wooded area” of “Paisley Forest,” touted the building’s “excellent brick construction, large living room with fireplace, large dining room and kitchen, side porch, approximately 18x13, 3 bedrooms and tile bath on 2nd floor.” Constructed in 1945 and selling for \$16,950, the house offered a “full basement with outside entrance, attached garage, oil heat, [and] fenced rear yard.”²⁷ Other promotional materials noted the “large living room with fireplace which will accommodate a grand piano,” and the subdivision’s convenient location to “shopping and transportation.”²⁸ A few of the newspaper advertisements in the early 1950s reference owners, many of whom worked for the U.S. government and in the army, being “transferred immediately.”

The original section of Dominion Hills (and later Section Two of Dominion Hills) was improved by Mace Properties, Inc. between 1945 and 1948. Mace Properties developed virtually all of the original section of Dominion Hills in 1945. Building permit records indicate that the real estate company received the majority of

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the permits in April and May of 1945 and continued to secure permits in August and December of 1945, illustrating their phased approach to development.²⁹ Promotional materials for the houses highlighted the “excellent construction,” “spacious rooms,” and their convenience to town and the Pentagon.³⁰ To further showcase the modest houses, Mace Properties, Inc. built their model homes often on prominent corner properties comprised of two or three lots. One such model home in the first section of Dominion Hills was located at 868 North Larrimore Street. Constructed in 1945, this dwelling commands the southwest corner of North Larrimore Street and 9th Street North. Another model house, located at 1029 North Liberty Street, also constructed in 1945, was promoted as “situated on [a] beautiful corner lot with high elevation in one of Arlington’s finest communities.”³¹ A few of the houses in this section were advertised in local newspapers with “GI Approved – Flexible Financing,” offered through the GI Bill of Rights, signed into law by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1944. This law provided veterans with federally guaranteed home with no down payment. This feature was designed to provide housing and assistance for veterans and their families, especially during the post-World War II years and Mace Properties, by advertising this benefit, displayed their propensity to target this predominantly modest-income clientele.

Merwin A. “John” Mace (c. 1900-1969), a real estate broker, developer, and builder, began building individual houses in western Arlington County in the late 1920s and established Mace Properties in 1937.³² Mace’s success was, in large part, due to his ability to capitalize on FHA programs enacted in the mid-1930s that facilitated financing of large housing construction projects by providing mortgage insurance. Following and experimenting with the standards and guidelines set by the FHA, Mace became one of the most prolific developers and merchant builders of northern Arlington County. He is credited with constructing over 4,000 houses in the county, in addition to numerous apartment buildings and shopping centers.³³ Subdivisions and neighborhoods developed by Mace include GlebeWood Village (1937-1938), Westmont (1939), Westover (1939-1940), and the Highlands (1940). Over the course of his career, Mace became known as a “civic-minded pioneer” because of his company’s high construction standards and low building costs. His houses were hailed for their individuality and their structural quality, attributes typically associated with higher-cost neighborhoods.³⁴ By 1955, Mace’s successful company, with offices on North Washington Boulevard in Arlington, operated as several divisions including Pollard Gardens, Westover, Inc., Mace Management, and Arlington Homes Corporation.³⁵ Mace Properties erected several houses in Sections One and Two of Dominion Hills for Arlington Homes Corporation, such as those located at 851 North Larrimore Street and 1003 North Patrick Henry Drive, built in 1948.³⁶

In the immediate post-war period, residential construction across the United States continued to be hampered by shortages of building materials. In the fall of 1945, when construction in Dominion Hills was getting underway, the Truman Administration briefly attempted to stimulate housing construction by removing wartime controls on building materials. The resulting building boom produced commercial and recreational construction but little housing suitable for veterans or others in the lower income brackets. In December 1945, the Office of War

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Mobilization and Reconversion re-imposed price controls, including rent control, and reinstated an allocation of building materials, with 50 percent of all construction materials to be channeled into housing, particularly veterans' housing. Nevertheless, the building industry continued to be hampered by supply shortages that were exacerbated by strikes and other labor problems.³⁷

In a letter to the president of the Dominion Hills Area Civic Association, known until May 1956 as the Dominion Hills-Paisley Forest Civic Association, Merwin Mace referred to the regulatory problems he encountered while constructing the original section of Dominion Hills.³⁸ He wrote that, "when the first section of Dominion Hills was built, we were nicely turned around by two government agencies having control of material prices and labor wage scales, and that as a result thereof it cost us in excess of \$100,000 to deliver homes to people who, in at least fifty percent of the cases, didn't even have signed contracts as evidence of our agreement."³⁹ The price controls remained in effect until November 1946, by which time production of building supplies was catching up with demand. Nationally, the construction of single-family houses increased dramatically in 1947, achieving a fourfold increase over the 1945 level and signaling the beginning of a building boom that peaked in 1949-1950.⁴⁰

Platting and Development of Section Two of Dominion Hills

In April 1946, Mace Properties platted Section Two of Dominion Hills, adjoining the eastern side of Benson & Vest's Paisley subdivision with the western side of the original section of Dominion Hills.⁴¹ In platting Section Two, Mace established a minimum house price of \$6,000 and prohibited the construction of metal garages. Minimum prices were seen as a way of controlling the quality and size of houses in the neighborhood and, thus, protecting the investment of purchasers. From October through December of 1946, Mace obtained building permits for almost all the dwellings constructed north of 9th Road North. The following year in June and July of 1947, he secured the building permits for all the dwellings south of 9th Road North. Only one dwelling was constructed by Mace Properties in 1948.⁴² The typical improved lot in Dominion Hills sold for \$12,000 in 1946; the corner lots sold for \$12,300. Within three years, Mace Properties had fully developed the two sections of the Dominion Hills subdivision and, by the end of 1948, the neighborhood was comprised of 361 houses constructed by Mace Properties. An advertisement in the *Washington Post* for the three-bedroom houses at 900 Patrick Henry Drive proclaimed it a "family home...designed for comfortable yet economical living" and described Dominion Hills as "popular with service personnel and people with growing families."⁴³ As in the first section of Dominion Hills, several houses were offered with GI-approved financing, reflecting some of the returning war veterans to whom the developers were appealing.

Although supply problems in building construction began to ease by late 1946, significant inflation in the costs of both building materials and labor in the post-World War II era created pressure to economize in both design and materials to keep prices within the reach of veterans and others needing moderately priced housing, which

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represented a large market share of potential home buyers. The increase in housing costs combined with the great need for housing, and the “general conservative stance” of the FHA guidelines were all “major factors affecting the appearance of house form and subdivision design...after World War II.”⁴⁴ As a result, many suburbs nationwide were “stylistically homogeneous neighborhoods.”⁴⁵ Yet, this was typically not the case in Arlington County, where developers and builders platted and improved small subdivisions or only a few lots within larger neighborhoods. Further, in an effort to provide individuality, many developers and builders offered an array of architectural styles and forms, such as the Tudor Revival, Dutch Colonial Revival, Craftsman, Cape Cod, Bungalow, and Foursquare; although Arlington County is, perhaps, best known for its two-story, Colonial Revival-style brick houses. Even in the earliest phases of construction, both Mace Properties and Benson & Vest strove to limit the assortment of styles and forms in Dominion Hills, constructing modest two-story, side-gabled, Colonial Revival-style dwellings with limited variations to the few models offered. Because the two different development companies used similar designs, forms, materials, and setting/siting, few neighborhoods in Arlington County exemplify this homogeneity as well as Dominion Hills.⁴⁶

No indication has been found that FHA mortgage insurance was used in the financing of the three subdivisions of Dominion Hills by either Benson & Vest or Mace Properties, Inc., even though both companies had completed projects in Virginia that had been FHA insured. Because the FHA has retained only a small sampling of the records of the projects it insured, the absence of FHA involvement cannot be ascertained definitively. However, the design and construction of Dominion Hills closely followed the standards prescribed by the FHA. In the years leading up to and after the war, the FHA produced a number of publications on “Minimum Construction Requirements for New Dwellings” to guide builders and developers in the construction of new houses eligible for FHA mortgage insurance.⁴⁷ The houses constructed by Benson & Vest and Mace Properties in Dominion Hills met, and in some cases exceeded, these minimum requirements and suggest the importance of following the FHA and Veteran Administration (VA) standards and guidelines. Whether receiving the FHA mortgage or not, the merchant builders most certainly used these documents, which, upon publication, created a standard that came to be expected by homebuyers seeking to purchase a house in Dominion Hills and the surrounding area. Moreover, veterans purchasing houses in the neighborhood would have been able to take advantage of various programs that allowed them to obtain guaranteed VA loans in lieu of up to \$2,000 in equity and FHA-insured mortgages.

Effects of the Better Homes and Small House Movement and the FHA Housing Philosophy

The speculative housing constructed in Dominion Hills during 1945 and 1948 exemplifies the housing constructed for buyers of moderate means during the mid-twentieth century in the United States. Architects, planners, social reformers, the building and real estate industry, and an increasingly influential and widespread publishing industry sought ways to encourage, facilitate, and promote the construction of quality housing for families of moderate means. Their efforts were often endorsed by national and local government officials and

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organizations. One of the leading organizers of this movement was Better Homes in America, Inc. Initially spearheaded by a women's magazine, it became a national educational organization in 1923 with Secretary of Commerce Herbert Hoover as its president. The organization's goal was to make "convenient, attractive and wholesome homes accessible to all American families."⁴⁸ It sought to encourage quality building and efficient design, install modern, labor-saving devices to reduce household drudgery, and provide economical furnishings, along with broader goals for improving family life. Much of its effort was focused on educating the consumer and, working with builders and local department stores, the local chapter sponsored show houses in the developing neighborhoods of Arlington County.

Simultaneous to the activities of Better Homes in America, the American Institute of Architects (AIA) tried to encourage builders to use architect-designed plans for the construction of small houses, which were defined as having a maximum of six rooms. The AIA sponsored the Architect's Small House Service Bureau as a means to provide architect-designed plans and specifications to builders. Other organizations similarly sought to promote the use of architect-designed plans for small houses, thus improving the quality of new residential construction. Increasingly, popular publications like *Better Homes & Gardens*, *House & Garden*, *McCall's*, and *Architectural Digest* addressed the interests and needs of owners of small houses, publishing successful designs and offering architect-designed plans for purchase.

The post-World War II houses constructed in the three sections of Dominion Hills not only offered features associated with small houses that the Better Homes of America and the Small House Bureau promoted, but also reflected the principles of the newly created Federal Housing Administration (FHA). In 1934, Congress enacted the National Housing Act, which created the FHA, as an essential step in achieving national recovery of the housing market. As described in a history of the FHA, "the immediate objectives of the Act were to make money available for repairs and new construction, to revive the homebuilding industry, to put men back to work, to restore confidence and to improve general economic conditions. The long range objectives were even more ambitious – to reform mortgage lending practices, to broaden opportunities for home ownership, to raise housing standards."⁴⁹ In 1936, the FHA published *Planning Neighborhoods for Small Houses*, which emphasized the importance of creating subdivisions with distinctive neighborhood qualities. It stated that, "where a neighborhood can be identified and comprehended as such, the feeling of pride and responsibility which the owner has in his own parcel, tends to be extended to the neighborhood as a whole. A sense of community responsibility and a community spirit thus develop, which acts as a stabilizing and sustaining influence in the maintenance of realty values."⁵⁰ The FHA set out to bring the benefits of planning to modestly priced housing developments, noting that, "for many years planning has been characteristic of 'exclusive' neighborhoods or subdivisions of high-priced homes.... Unfortunately, neighborhoods for modest dwellings have only rarely been developed in this manner. Frequently they have been produced devoid of plan or protection as lot selling schemes, wholly unrelated to the character of dwellings which might sometime be built."⁵¹

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The standards established by the FHA for evaluating residential subdivisions are clearly seen in Dominion Hills. These standards, firstly, aimed to seek “sound evidence of a continuing demand for housing in the proposed price range,” which most certainly was the case in Arlington County in the early to mid-twentieth century. Secondly, the setting of the neighborhood was taken into account, with the “appropriate residential surroundings and natural topographical features” to enhance the neighborhood. Western Arlington County, which had been in part subdivided but not developed prior to World War II, had remained predominately rural and was used for truck farming. Thus, the landscape remained open and natural. Thirdly, the residents of the neighborhood needed to have “accessibility to schools, employment, and shopping and recreational centers,” either within the new subdivision or in close proximity. Although the merchant builders of Dominion Hills would not directly provide these amenities to residents of the subdivision, they foresaw the necessity and fostered social ties with neighboring communities and shopping districts. Fourthly, the FHA suggested “suitable utility and street improvements” should be provided. Improvements such as sewage and water were completed by the county in the late 1920s, ensuring overall public health. Street improvements, an ongoing enhancement provided by the county as subdivisions were platted and subsequently grew, were provided around Dominion Hills in the first half of the twentieth century and, thus, were well established by the time the neighborhood was developed. The fifth FHA element was “conformity of the neighborhood to planning regulations and sound principles of design.” This was easily achieved by the merchant builders of Dominion Hills, who were well versed in the development and growth of the county’s neighborhoods, the county’s regulations, and the needs and architectural preferences of its residential population. The sound principles of design they utilized were intended to ensure preservation of the individual houses and, thus, the neighborhood as a whole, which as a result has seen few additions and replacements. The final two FHA provisions were related to reasonable taxes and assessments, adequate zoning, and protective covenants, which included regulation of land use, architectural control, side yard and setback regulations, regulation of lot sizes, and prohibition of nuisances. Instituting the lowest taxes in the Commonwealth of Virginia and the Washington metropolitan area, Arlington County had adopted a Comprehensive Zoning Plan in 1942 that established minimum land area requirements for each type of residential land use.⁵²

Directed and influenced by the FHA’s standards, the merchant builders of Dominion Hills clearly incorporated these provisions into their neighborhood plan and the housing they constructed in the first three sections of Dominion Hills from 1945 through 1948. However, no indication has yet been found that either Benson & Vest or Mace Properties, Inc., sought approval for FHA financing. Further, because the FHA has retained only a small sampling of the records of the projects it insured, the absence of FHA involvement cannot be ascertained definitively. Yet, the construction and development of Dominion Hills most certainly followed the standards prescribed by the FHA, as well as those espoused by the Better Homes of America and the Small House Bureau. In addition, both developers were known to have successfully completed FHA-insured residential projects elsewhere in Arlington County and were actively constructing housing for the lower- to middle-income bracket.

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The Influence of the Merchant Builder and the Colonial Revival Style in Dominion Hills

Both Benson & Vest and Mace Properties brought previous experience in building low-cost housing to the Dominion Hills neighborhood. The houses they constructed addressed the aspirations of people of moderate incomes who wanted more space and comfort after the privations of the war years. Prospective homeowners wanted features and conveniences associated with more expensive housing, but they also sought the security of traditional architecture. Both builders were able to balance the needs of homebuyers with concepts of merchant building that included mass production and standardization. One of the most common modes of standardization was the use of a single architectural style. The Colonial Revival style was the predominant architectural fashion for new construction in the years immediately following the war. Numerous developers, builders, and architects embraced the Colonial Revival style to meet the housing needs of suburban Arlington County in the mid-twentieth century, offering homeowners security with traditional architectural elements that pre-dated the difficult years of the Great Depression and World Wars. The dispersion of the style to the suburbs and the mass production of Colonial Revival architectural elements, along with the rising prices of building materials and the economic demands of prospective homeowners resulted in interpretations of the style that were more modest and plain in both form and detail. Commonly found features of the style include accentuated main entry doors, symmetrically balanced facades, single double-hung sash windows, and side gable roofs – features utilized fully and successfully by the merchant builders of Dominion Hills.

Although working independently, yet most assuredly in concert, Benson & Vest and Mace Properties constructed nearly identical two-story, Colonial Revival-style houses. The new houses respected the traditional style, but offered the conveniences of modern living. The modest designs with little decorative detail are reflective of an effort to reduce costs, yet provide a traditional high-quality product. The conservative approach to post-war design was described in the *House-of-the-Month Book of Small Houses*, published in 1946:

Surveys conclusively prove that the large majority of prospective buyers definitely prefer the so-called standard type of architecture that was prevalent before the war. All of the text and pictures devoted to dream-houses and magic-houses during the war years is apparently having little influence upon today's prospective home buyers. House design has always been a slow evolutionary process, and both home builders and mortgage lenders have been ultra cautious in accepting overnight every new house fad with which they have been confronted.⁵³

The same house plan, massing, and fenestration were used by both developers throughout their respective subdivisions. In the original section of Dominion Hills, distinctiveness was presented merely by varying the wood surround of the main entry. Section Two of Dominion Hills achieved variety through the application of colored asbestos shingles on the upper story and several different configurations of brick surrounds framing the

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main entries. The dwellings constructed by Benson & Vest are remarkably similar to those being constructed contemporaneously by Mace Properties. The earliest building permit secured by Benson & Vest for the Paisley subdivision was in May 1945, just one month after Mace Properties began construction. The few options offered by the builder included the addition of a third bay on the modest two-story, Colonial Revival-style houses. The three-bay-wide houses had a center entry and ornamentation was limited to a one-story, one-bay-square porch on the main façade. Ornamentation on the two-bay-wide houses was limited to a side porch that sheltered the main entry on one of the models.

As noted in a 1948 article in the *Washington Post*, the majority of post-war construction in Arlington County was the two-story brick-veneered house. The article noted that builders' reasoning was "simple. Such homes meet all zoning regulations. Financing is easier, customer acceptance has been favorable. Most builders reason: we have a good product, so why tread unbeaten paths? Ramblers are few and far between.... Since the two-story brick homes are essentially out of the same mold, prices vary little for the same product. Land cost and extra trimmings make up the differences."⁵⁴ By constructing the same or similar models throughout the subdivision, both Benson & Vest and Mace Properties were able to secure large quantities of materials at reduced prices and were able to standardize construction, thus resulting in faster construction; all of which are qualities common to successful merchant building in the post-war years.

Although the three subdivisions that now compose Dominion Hills were developed separately by two development companies, both Benson & Vest and Mace Properties had the same vision for the development of their respective subdivisions. The combination of two-story Colonial Revival-style houses constructed between 1945 and 1948 in Dominion Hills reflects a singular architectural style and form that has resulted in a cohesive and unified neighborhood. The repetition of form, style, materials, and setting/siting reflects the modest design aesthetics of post-war Arlington County as well as the principles of mass production, standardization, and large-scale development that is reflective of larger post-war development in the United States.

Development of Dominion Hills: 1950s-1960s

During the 1950s and into the 1960s, as the Dominion Hills neighborhood grew and solidified, the area attracted a population of young families who were drawn to the affordable housing options in a convenient location and who worked primarily for the U.S. Government. The area, with its easy commute to and from Washington, D.C., also presented itself as a community by establishing civic amenities such as the Dominion Hills-Paisley Forest Civic Association in 1950, later renamed the Dominion Hills Civic Association in May 1956. The association's presidents included such residents as Herbert E. Hoffman (1950), an attorney for the U.S. Justice Department who lived at 1003 North Livingston, and G. J. Freisem (1951), an employee of the General Accounting Office who resided at 909 North Larrimore Street. Early residents of Dominion Hills, represented by the civic neighborhood association, reflect the influx of returning World War II veterans, as well as a large

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number of government workers in the Washington metropolitan area. In addition, early notable residents included acclaimed actors Warren Beatty and Shirley MacLaine, both of whom lived with their family at 930 North Liberty Street in the 1950s.

Since its initial development, Dominion Hills has proven to be a popular neighborhood for local residents who require amenities such as new public schools, a recreational center, a park, and limited commercial development, which was found along Wilson Boulevard. The McKinley Elementary School (1950) and Ashlawn Elementary School (1956), both constructed outside the neighborhood's boundaries in the 1950s, served Dominion Hills and neighboring communities. In 1954, the neighborhood's residents established the Dominion Hills Area Recreation Association, purchasing the historic Powhatan Springs Estate, originally a roadhouse and inn, located nearby at 6000 Wilson Boulevard, and constructed a community pool.⁵⁵ Since parkland was important to the residents and to the developers, Mace Park, located along Four Mile Run east of Patrick Henry Drive, was formally dedicated on June 1, 1957 with land donated by Mace Properties, Inc. and held in trust by the Dominion Hills Civic Association for use as a public playground and recreational area for residents of the neighborhood. In the 1960s, the Dominion Hills Shopping Center at 6013-6035 Wilson Boulevard, constructed in 1962 and 1963, as well as the Dominion Hills Professional Center at 6045 Wilson Boulevard, built by Better Homes Realty in 1966, improved the area and provided much-needed amenities for residents. These entities, although all outside the boundaries of the original Dominion Hills neighborhood, emphasize Dominion Hill's role in the development of Arlington County during the mid-twentieth century and its significance as a cohesive residential hub supporting ancillary amenities since its initial construction in the years 1945 to 1948.

Dominion Hills Today

Since its construction in the mid- to late-1940s, Dominion Hills has sustained its identity as an enclave of single-family dwellings set between the commercial corridor of Wilson Boulevard to the south and Interstate 66 to the north. The curving streets and overall plan of the first three sections of Dominion Hills have been preserved. The houses in Dominion Hills have sustained relatively few changes, limited to a small number of sensitive alterations and additions, while many of the houses still display original elements such as asbestos shingles, windows, and doors. Although a number of the houses have been re-clad in vinyl and aluminum siding, they continue to exhibit the concept of affordable and durable materials that are typical of Arlington County's mid-twentieth-century housing stock.

While the construction of Interstate 66 in the late 1970s precipitated the demolition of a number of houses in the neighborhood, primarily along Four Mile Run Drive, and disgruntled many of the residents, the implementation of the six-lane highway reflected the region's growing dependence on automobiles for travel. This six-lane interstate highway, running west from Washington, D.C. into northern Virginia, along the Arlington corridor,

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largely followed the right of way of the old Washington & Old Dominion Railroad. Likewise, in 1981, Patrick Henry Drive was extended across North Four Mile Run Drive to facilitate travel between Dominion Hills and the neighborhood of Westover to the north, making the road a major thoroughfare. Further improvements to the neighborhood included the opening of the Metrorail Orange Line, located in the Interstate 66 median strip, in the summer of 1986. These transportation improvements further reinforced the area's proximity to Washington, D.C., and nearby commercial development and facilities – long seen as one of the neighborhood's major attractions, working to increase its property values. The neighborhood exists today as a cohesive post-World War II residential neighborhood, containing an exceptionally high level of integrity that differentiates it from other contemporaneous communities within Arlington County.

Multiple Property Nomination Registration Requirements

Dominion Hills is being nominated under the Multiple Property Document (MPD), *Historic Residential Suburbs in the United States, 1830-1960* (National Park Service, 2002). This neighborhood possesses the physical and associative characteristics typical of one of the four subtypes outlined in the MPD as historic residential suburbs – Post-World War II and Early Freeway Suburbs, 1945 to 1960. As stated in the Registration Requirements of the MPD, Dominion Hills qualifies under Criterion A because it “reflects an important historic trend in the development and growth of a locality... [and it] represents an important event or association, such as the expansion of housing associated with wartime industries during World War II.” Under Criterion C, Dominion Hills is home to a “collection of residential architecture...[exhibiting] important example[s] of distinctive period construction, method[s] of construction...[the] suburb reflects principles of design important in the history of community planning...[and the suburb] embodies high artistic values through its overall plan or the design of entranceways, streets, homes, and community spaces.”⁵⁶

This locally significant neighborhood reflects important local trends for which a historic residential suburb may qualify for National Register listing, such as:

- The neighborhood's planning and construction is related to the expansion of local industry, wartime industry, important stages in metropolitan development, or broad national trends such as returning GIs, the Better Homes movement, and the bungalow craze.
- The neighborhood—through its site plan, overall landscape design, and house design—reflects historic principles of design or achieved high artistic quality in the areas of community planning, landscape architecture, or architecture.
- Suburb possesses the artistic design and many of the physical characteristics intended by the developers, planners, landscape architects, architects, and engineers working collaboratively during the period of significance.
- Neighborhood reflects the principles and practices of subdivision design and residential development representative of mainstream national trends from 1830 to 1960.

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- Suburb reflects artistic qualities of landscape design in the layout of streets, the arrangement of homes on house lots, the planting of vegetation for ornamentation or shade, and the creation of a parklike setting.
- Neighborhood exemplifies the role that a certain type of developer (subdivider, home-builder, community builder, operative builder, or merchant builder) played in the growth and development of the locality or metropolitan region.
- Subdivision contains a collection of residences in types and styles representative of local building practices, economic trends, and popular tastes in suburban housing associated with one or more stages of a community's suburbanization.
- Community was designed to conform to FHA-standards and represents one of the "earliest," "most successful," "largest," "finest," or "most influential" examples locally.
- Suburb possesses a high degree of integrity and exhibiting distinctive elements of design in the subdivision plan, landscape architecture, or domestic architecture.
- Neighborhood reflects important advances, established principles, or popular in trends in community planning, landscape architecture, and architecture.
- Suburb contains homes in a variety of period styles, or representing the work of one or a number of noted architects.
- Collection of residential architecture includes fine examples of one or more locally important housing types (e.g. bungalows and foursquares).
- Residential area was associated with important local industries or local events and activities that are known to [have] stimulated or sustained suburban growth and development.⁵⁷

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10. Geographical Data

Verbal Boundary Description (Describe the boundaries of the property.)

Dominion Hills is located in the western portion of Arlington County, near the boundary with Fairfax County. The northern boundary of Dominion Hills is located south of North Four Mile Run Drive and is formed by the northern property line of those lots facing 10th Road North. The boundary extends to the east, turning south past the properties fronting North Liberty Street and continuing along the eastern (rear) property line of the properties facing North Larrimore Street. Residential and commercial development on the north side of Wilson Boulevard has been excluded from the boundaries because it does not relate to the historic context. The southern boundary follows the properties fronting 9th Street North. Moving westward, the boundary extends to North Lebanon Street, where it turns north and again captures the buildings on the north side of 9th Street North. Following 9th Street North, the boundary travels to North Madison Street and includes those properties on the east side of the street. The boundary turns west past the northern property line of the lots facing 9th Road North and continues to North McKinley Road, including those properties on the east side of the street. The western boundary includes all those properties fronting 10th Road North and North Montana Street.

The boundaries are indicated by the UTM coordinates stated herein and the accompanying county-based map.

Boundary Justification (Explain why the boundaries were selected.)

The neighborhood is composed of three subdivisions: Paisley (platted 1942), Dominion Hills (platted 1942), and Section 2 of Dominion Hills (platted 1946), which were developed contemporaneously between 1945 and 1948 and thus read as an amalgamated residential neighborhood. Dominion Hills encompasses these three subdivisions as they were platted. Commercial development and non-historic residential development along Wilson Boulevard were excluded; although located on lots platted as part of Dominion Hills, these properties reflect neither the residential nature of the community nor the period of significance. Four properties along the southern end of the neighborhood have also been excluded from the boundaries; located on the east side of North Liberty Street and the west side of North Larrimore Street on the 800 block. These properties were initially improved by Mace Properties but have either been altered by the construction of additions that would render them non-contributing to an historic district, or the original buildings have been demolished and replaced with buildings dating from the late twentieth century.
