The Patrick County courthouse is a dignified country example of Jeffersonian Neo-Classicism located in a small county seat. The original structure is a two-story building consisting of a projecting, three-bay central block with flanking wings. In typical Jeffersonian fashion, the building is of red brick and had white, stuccoed Tuscan columns and white wooden trim. The columns and trim are now a light beige, and the brickwork has been cleaned and repointed. On the central block, the brick is laid in common bond up to the second floor level, and from there it is laid in Flemish bond. The wings are laid in Flemish-bond brick set on a base of common bond. Sides of the building are laid in common bond.

The wings have low-pitched gable roofs and strongly projecting cornices. The gable end of the central portion extends to form the pediment of a tetrastyle portico which stands on brick piers. The wide intercolumniation is characteristic of Jeffersonian Neo-Classicism as is the semi-circular opening in the pediment of the portico. The bell in the small tower is rung to mark courtdays. The doorway of the main entry is not original and probably dates from a remodeling in 1928. Window openings are six-over-six and, like the doors, have lintels and granite sills. The shutters are no longer in place. Reveals and soffits of the original openings have diamond panels.

The second story of the central section serves as the courtroom. Very little original trim remains. The shape has been changed by a twentieth-century enlargement which extended the room toward the rear. The present courtroom is the result of a handsome 1928 remodeling by T.E. Adkins of Stuart as well as later refurbishings in 1936 and 1971. The second story of the south wing now houses the County Administrator's office with the jury room in the rear addition. The Commissioner of Revenue is in the north wing with the judge's office in the rear addition. On the first floor, the Clerk's offices occupy the southern portion of the building, and the Treasurer's offices are in the north side. Through the years, these offices have been considerably changed, but in the Treasurer's office two of the original Classical Revival mantels are still in place. They stand back-to-back, one facing into the central block and one into the north wing. Each consists of pilasters supporting a plain frieze beneath a simple mantel.

Constant use as well as expanding needs and interest have brought about a number of changes in this courthouse. In addition to those mentioned, a jail was added to the rear of the courthouse in 1928. At one time, the area in front of the courthouse was enclosed by wooden fencing which was replaced, apparently in the early part of the twentieth century, by an iron fence. In the northeast corner of the enclosure is a Confederate memorial statue dedicated in 1936 to the memory of Major General J.E.B. Stuart. As a result of these modifications, in the words of a Patrick citizen:

The Court Room and Jury Room walls are clean and unblemished. The casual visitor will see no graft-inspired display of unsuitable elegance. This Court House is ... a work-shop in which County officials and employes are trying their best to serve the people.

The Patrick County courthouse has served as the governmental architectural focal point for its southern Piedmont county for over a hundred and fifty years. Cherished by the citizens as their county's premier landmark, the dignified edifice is a good example of the simple Roman Revival public buildings whose designs were inspired by the architecture of Thomas Jefferson.

The present courthouse was built to replace an earlier one completed in 1794 and located slightly to the west of the present structure. The county, which was named for Patrick Henry, was created from "that part of the (Henry) County called the Hollows" by a bill effective June 1, 1791. The first court was held in the home of Jonathan Hanby. Soon afterwards, Eliphaz Shelton donated ten acres for the centrally-located courthouse site. The town, established at this site in 1782, took the name Taylorsville which in 1884 was changed to Stuart in honor of Major General J.E.B. Stuart, a Patrick County native. It is unclear where the county court met in the years between the first meeting at the home of Jonathan Hanby and the completion of the 1794 courthouse.

By June 18, 1819, the county's needs had outgrown the capacities of its courthouse. Abram Staples, Harvey Fitzgerald, and German Baker thus were directed to advertise in Franklin, Henry, Montgomery, Patrick counties, Stokes, N.C., and in the Lynchburg Press for bids on the construction of a new courthouse to be completed by November Court, 1821. These directives were overly optimistic, for it was not until July 15, 1821 that a location for the new courthouse (in front, i.e., to the east, of the old courthouse) was set. In the meantime, Abram Staples, one of the commissioners, was appointed builder. By July 11, 1822, he had completed the courthouse which was accepted by the commissioners with the reservation that certain unspecified defective building materials be replaced. Evidently Mr. Staples took care of the problems, for no further mention of them appears in the Order Books.
