Introduction

The Park Place Historic District was originally listed in the National Register of Historic Places on February 10, 2006. This additional documentation is being submitted to correct mapping of the historic boundary and to add one entry in the district inventory. Due to professional error, the property at 3709 Llewellyn Avenue in Norfolk was excluded from the historic district boundary. This property is at the edge of the district, at the intersection of Llewellyn Avenue and 38th Street. The dwelling's architectural character, along with the fact that it is immediately adjacent on two sides to the existing district boundary (see attached maps), demonstrate that its exclusion from the Park Place Historic District nomination was an oversight.

Following is the inventory entry and narrative description for 3709 Llewellyn Avenue.

 DESCRIPTION:

This house is a two-and-a-half story, two-bay frame, Folk Victorian dwelling built on an elevated brick foundation over a likely full basement. The house is clad in vinyl siding except for the historic wood shingles in the gable and dormer pediments. The single-story, full-width front porch is accessed by a wood stair with metal hand rails at the right end. The porch has a fully developed entablature with dentils and is supported by three Tuscan columns; a pair of large green awnings covers much of the top half of the porch. The porch has a traditional baluster running between the columns. The entry features a

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historic door with two horizontal wood. panels at the base and a large, single light in the top half. The door is flanked by vertical, single-pane sidelights, with panels below, as well as a three-light transom with the central pane being the width of the door. The windows appear to be one-over-one replacement vinyl sash with storm sash. Nearly all windows have green awnings and many have air conditioning units inserted into the lower sash. The first and second stories have a bay window in the middle of the facade as well as in the middle of the southern side of the house.

The attic story features a steep, front-gable roof covered in slate with a slight eave overhang. The front gable has a simple Palladian window surrounded by wood shingle siding. There is a cross gable which is set just below the peak of the main roof gable and its pediments feature a single window surrounded by wood shingles. There is also a single, large pedimented dormer on the front half of the south side of the roof which features three windows and a small shingled pediment above. A large internal running bond brick chimney rises from the rear half of the house, offset to the south side. The north side of the house is less ornate with no dormer, no windows on the front half, no awnings, and a non-historic, single-leaf entry at the ground level. There are small basement windows in the brick foundation. This house contributes to the Park Place Historic District as an excellent example of an early twentieth century dwelling in good condition. It is also one of the grander houses in the district.
